

Toun Tomy (55) -- Local 45

Tuinn Féime, Tomy's wave. (This is a very celebrated feature).

(Tountoma would do, but the m is remarkably liquid. J.O'D.)

Tountoma -- J.O'D.

Situated in Dingle Bay on the west side of Rossbeagh point. This is a large rock much dreaded by sailors.

Killeen -- John Sullivan, Lickeen; J.O'D.

Situated in the East of Td. Keel, Parish of Glanbeagh & Barony of Magunnahy. This is a burial place for children; it is not fenced in.

Caragh Lake -- Michl. Moriarty, Lauher 45

Loe Cartaiige, lough of the river Carhagh.

Lo. Caragh -- J.O'D. (See Killorglin).

Situated on the boundary between the parishes of Glanbeagh and Knockaun. This is a large lake of water surrounded nearly by mountains; it is remarkable for its trout and salmon fishery, the river Cara passes through it.

Illaunminnaan (72) -- Local 47

Cileán Mionán, island of the kids.

Illaunminnaan -- J.O'D.

Situated in the East of townland Droum, Parish of Glanbeagh, Barony of Magunnahy and County of Kerry. This is a small island belonging to townland Droum, lying at the junction of the rivers Meelagh and Carragh.

Meelagh River (71, 72) -- John Sullivan, Lickeen; J.O'D. 48

Situated in the Parish of Glanbeagh. This river rises in the South West of the Parish of Glanbeagh, flows in a North East direction thro' sd. parish; forms the boundary betwn. Droumbrain & Dreenagh, empties itself into the River Caragh (of which it is a tributary) at the junction at Droum & Lickeen.
