In the S. Western part of the Parish of Kenmare, and bounded on the N. by the townlands of Gurtnadillogh (West), Gurtnadillogh (East) and Corrignahehalan; on the E. and S.E. by Gurtrooskagh and Derrygorriv; on the South by Rusheens and on the W. and N.W. by Mucksna.

Townland the property of the Marquis of Landsdowne and it consists principally of Mountain pasture with a considerable quantity of tillage interspersed through it, having a bye road running therethrough, and an oak wood along its E. boundary; on which also a large stream flows. Names in this Townland are Glasshegarriv, B. 831, p.9. Ballygriffin Wood B. 831, p.10.
