In the S. West of the Parish of Kenmare and bounded on the N. and partly on the E. by the townland of Gurtalinny (South); on the East also by Gurraaveen; on the South by Gurtrooskagh and Ballygriffin and on the West by Gurtnadillogh.

Townland, the property of Marquis of Lansdowne; consisting principally of mountain pasture with a stripe of tillage along its N.E. boundary and a few patches interspersed near its centre. The road leading from Bantry to Kenmare runs through it and the Rooghty River runs for a considerable distance on its Eastern boundary. There is also a plantation in the N.E. extremity of the townland.
