

- Caherferta -- Local 39  
 Catair feartha , stone fort of the grave.
- Caherferta -- T.O'C. J.O.D.  
 Situated in the townland of Killykel about 6 chains to the West of the standing stone.  
 An ancient earthen fort.
- Ballykilly castle ruins (14) -- Local 40  
 See P.L. -- J.O.D.  
 Situated about the centre of the townland of Ballykilly.  
 This old castle is now a heap of ruins razed to the very foundation, it had been undermined about 20 years ago and fell, the walls are 5 feet thick.
- The Garrison ++ Local 40  
 J.O.D.  
 Situated in the South of townland Kilmoyly North.  
 This is a rectangular earthen enclosure, the banks are both high and thick and seem to have been raised for defensive purposes.
- Kilmoyly church ruins -- Local 41  
 See parish -- J.O.D.  
 Situated in the North of townland Kilmoyly South.  
 There is a grave yard annexed to the ruins, which are nearly razed to the ground except the South wall which is about 10 feet high and two feet thick.
- Poulthaul na mung -- Local 42  
 Portac na mung , bog of the sedgy morafs.
- Portaghnamong -- J.O.D.  
 Situated in the South of townland Bally Mc Andrew and on the North side of road.  
 This is an ancient earthen fort.
- Glounrakeen fort (20) -- Local 43  
 Glean<sup>1</sup> rait caoin , glen of the beautiful fort.  
 Glenrakeen fort -- J.O.D.
