Situated in the Northern part of the parish and is bounded West by the townland of Cahernaan and Lough lane or lower lake of Killarney N, by Poulnamuck and Listymoreugh, E, by Do and Ardagh and S, by Carrigafreehaun.

This townland contains            acres of arable and excellent land and            acres of wood. The proprietor Denis Shine Lawlor Esqr has it in his own possession Castlelough Castle is in the S.W. end of this townland. County Cess not paid by the acre but calculated in proportion as it is levied on the gneives.
