This is a small lake but remarkable for the number and size of its trout.

Killarney Hospital -- Inhabitants 48
J.O.D.

Situated in the S. end of the townland of Mooghtera and about 12 chains S.E. of the town of Killarney.

This is a Medical, Surgical, and Fever Hospital. It is supported by subscription and County Grant, which grant is always made equal to the subscription, it contains 58 beds fit to receive patients, and is attended by a physician, a surgeon, and an Apothicary.

Killarney Methodist Chapel -- Inhabitants 48
J.O.D.

Situated in the N. end of the Main street of the town of Killarney

This chapel was built in 1832 by subscription at the expense of £256.

Karl of Kenmare's House -- Inhabitants 49
J.O.D.

Situated in the N. end of the Demesne and about 3 chains South of the town of Killarney.

This is a very handsome house beautifully shaded with shrubs and trees by which and the Demesne wall they preclude a view of the house from any part of the streets of the town of Killarney.

Killarney Church -- Inhabitants 49

Cill Áirne.

Situated in the South end of the Main street and town of Killarney.

This church was rebuilt in 1810 in which are the following Monuments, viz. Thos Viscount Kenmare dated 1795. T.L. Boland 1709, Arthur Herbert Esqr 1833, Captain Turners wife 1825, Arthur Hyde 1833, Francis Boland Esqr 1778, Richard Herbert 1832, Captn Kings wife 1778, Major John Adams 1781, Revd William Harding 1836 and Lord Aylmer 1785.

Killarney R.C. Chapel -- Inhabitants 50
J.O.D.

Situated in the centre of New street of the town of Killarney and on the N. side.

This chapel was built in 1770 by subscription, and through the execution of the Rev Mr O'Flaherty who was then parish priest. It
