O'Sullivan's Punch Bowl

Situated in the East boundary between the townland of Glenaa and Binish Island and belongs to the townland of Glenaa.

This Bowl is a circular basin of water, through which boats may pass from upper to lower lake without getting into the middle lake. The stream passes through it, yet its waters appear to be still on account of its depth of the two it is considered to be the more dangerous passage.

Situated in the South end of the townland of Glenaa near the long range and midway between upper and lower lake of Killarney.

This is a very high cliff where the eagle has built her nest, and inaccessible to all human appearance, yet there has an instance of her been robed, by means of a rope which was made fast round a man's middle and let him descend from the top of the rock, the other end of the rope at the same time being held fast by two other men at the top, and pulled up again unhurt - this happened in the year 1820.
