

Long Range (contd)

This Long Range is a wide Channel navigable for boats passing from upper to Middle Lake and Lower Lake s. Gentlemen in their passage here generally have key bugles and each boat a short piece of cannon in order to rise an echo. This echo is most astonishing at the foot of the Eagles Nest, a single note on the ket bugle will be resounded no less than 20 times.

Situated in the townland of Killarney.

The main street of this townland lies nearly North and South, the breadth of which is 52 feet, the houses in this street are general: from 2 to 4 story high, in the N. end is a Methodist Chapel, and in the South is the Church, Kenmare Arms Hotel is also in the South end nearly in the centre of this street on the East side stands the old market house dated 1733, opposite which on the West side is New street which is set off at right angles to the former, the breadth of which is 52 feet, the houses in this street are generally from 3 to 4 story high, handsomely built, in the centre on the N. side is the R.C. Chapel on the same side and in the extreme end of the street is the Convent, In the South end nearly of the main street on the East side is hen street which is set off nearly at right angles, and continuous this direction for 5 chains and then takes a North East direction, and lands within 250 links of the Courthouse, and the intermediate space is taken up by the potatoe market on saturdays only, the breadth of this street is irregular and the houses far inferior to the former. The hospital is about 12 chains S.E. of the N. end and Earl Kenmare's House, about 3 chains S. of the South end of the town. It is visited by a gentlemen from all parts of Europe to view the seminaries sceneries of the lakes of Killarney.
