Situated in the N.W. end of the parish, and is bounded S. by the townland of Muckruss, Brickeen island, and Dinish Island and the townland of Glenaa, W. and N. by the parish of Aghadoc, E. by the townlands of Carrigafreehaun, Castlelough, Cahernaan, Reen and Bunrour.

This lake contains _____ acres, and is interspersed with islands which are covered with shrubs and trees for the most part of every description. Ross Castle stands at the N.E. point of it. and in the Summer season it is daily traversed by gentlemen mostly foreigners to view the scenery of this lake and its islands.

Situated in the West end of the parish and is bounded N. and E by the townland of Muckruss, South by the townland of Rosshongarry Turk and Gurtracussaan, and West by Gurtracussaan, Dinish Island, and Brickeen Island.

This lake contains _____ acres, and has no islands except one which is called Devils island, the great and majestic Turk Mountain stands on the S.E. side of it.

Situated in the S.W. end of the parish, and is bounded South by the townlands of Gurtrooa and Derrycunahy, W. by the parish of Knockaun, N. and E. by the townland of Glenaa and Gurtararee.

This lake contains _____ acres, and is of a long and irregular form, it contains a few small islands which have no great variety of shrubs or trees. The Southern extremity is about 8 miles S.W. of the town of Killarney.
