Horses Glen	-- Inhabitants

Situated in the S.E. end of the townland of Cools and E. of the Devils Punch Bowl.

This glen is uncommonly steep, making an angle of elevation with Mangerton N. of 30 degrees and with Mangerton South about 45 degrees. It comprises Lougherhagh and Loughmanagh, and thence turns nearly at right angles to the N. to Loughagarrigarry where it terminates. There is an astonishing echo in this glen.

Situated between Lower and Middle lake of Killarney.

This bridge has but one arch which is navigable for Boats wherein gentlemen pass from Lower lake to Turk or Middle lake.

Situated in the East end of the townland of Glenaa and a few chains S.W. of Lady Kenmare's Cottage.

This chair is a wooden seat only, from which there is a gravel walk to the cottage. It is placed on an eminence overlooking the Lake. The stag when hunted generally takes the water a little N. of this which often proves an engaging sight.
