

## Lord's Flag (contd)

Situated near Glass Loughs and in the boundary of the meeting of the three parishes (viz) Ph of Killarney, ph of Kenmare, and Ph of Knockaun.

This is a rock about 20 links diameter. The Marquis of Lansdowne Lord Kenmare, and Mr Herbert took luncheon there, from which circumstances it derives its name.

## Coars Waterfall

Situated in the boundary between the townland of Coars and Gurtroca and about 100 links South of the old road which led from Killarney to Kenmare.

This Waterfall is about 65 links perpendicular height.

## Mulgrave Police Station

-- Inhabitants

Situated in the S.E. end of the townland of Derrycunnahy and a few chains W. of Galways Bridge on the new line of road leading from Killarney to Kenmare.

This is a police station handsomely built with 2 towers, one on the S.W. and the other on the N.E. corner of the barrack each about 42 feet in height, built by government in 1832. It was visited by Lord Mulgrave in the year 1836 hence it derives its name.

## Galway's Bridge

Called after Sean Gaillighe i.e. John Galway.

Situated in the boundary between the townlands of Derrycunnahy and Gurtroca, and on the new line of road leading from Killarney to Kenmare.

This bridge has 2 arches only, from which at the North side at the distance of 100 links there is a gradual waterfall of 30 links.

## Rustic Bridge

Situated in the boundary between the townlands of Derrycunnahy and Gurtroca, and near the extremity of the River Galway where it empties itself into upper lake of Killarney.

This is a wooden bridge, whose breadth is 3 feet with railing on each side, and is supported by 2 iron bars which are placed
