

## Rustic Bridge (contd)

perpendicular in a rock in the centre of the river. On each side of this bridge is a waterfall, which is called by the inhabitants, upper and lower Waterfall. The lower is 120 links North of the bridge whose perpendicular height is 20 links. The upper waterfall is about 10 chains South of the bridge and its perpendicular height is 30 links. This bridge was made in 1838 by the proprietor Henry A Herbert Esqr.

Hyde's Cottage -- Inhabitants 37

Duibinis , black island.

Situated in the N.E. end of the townland of Derrycunnahy and 100 links W. of Rustic Bridge and also within a few chains on the West side of upper lake.

This cottage is in ruins, and is much shaded with shrubs and trees which intercept a view of the upper lake of Killarney to which it is so closely posited. There is an old gravel walk leading from it to the new line of road which leads from Killarney to Kenmare.

Situated in the S.W. end of Dinish island near the meeting of the waters.

This is a handsome thatched cottage with shrubs and trees except on the East side, where there is a glass window 8 feet square from which there is a grand view of Turk or Middle Lake of Killarney

Turk Cottage (74) -- Inhabitants 38

Torc Cottage J.O.D. -- Orthog Letter

Situated in the N.E. end of the townland of Turk, within a few chains of the S.E. end of Turk or Middle Lake of Killarney.

Turk Cottage, the seat of Henry A Herbert Esqr was originally a small cottage but in the year 1800 there was an addition put to it, at the expense of £1600. It is a handsome cottage 2 story high, beautifully posited having a splendid view of Muckruss and Turk Lake.
