

Turk Old Bridge (contd)

Situated in the boundary between the townlands of Turk and Cloghereen Upper and on the old road which formerly led from Killarney to Kenmare.

This is an old bridge having 2 arches, the workmanship at present shows it was formerly built to resist the violence of the mountain flood in the Winter Season. It stands on the stream that leads to Turk Cascade.

Turk New Bridge -- Inhabitants 39
J.O.D.

Situated on the new line of road leading from Killarney to Kenmare, and nearly central between Turk Cottage and Turk Cascade.

This bridge has 2 arches, one of which is for the use of Turk Cascade, and the other is appropriated to the use of gentlemen who may visit the cascade from Turk Cottage, from which there is a grand walk through the arch which leads to the summit of the cascade.

Hook Gap -- Inhabitants 39

Beal at Carrain, mouth of the Carran or serated rock.

Bealacurraun -- J.O.D.

Situated central in the West boundary of Clogherun lower and Drummyrouk.

This gap is 350 links in length, breadth about 30 links, with a perpendicular rock on each side about 80 feet in height.

Tunnel -- E. S. 40
Do J.O.D. -- Inhabitants

Situated in the N.E. end of the townland of Gurtroca, in the new line of road leading from Killarney to Kenmare, near the verge or brink of upper lake of Killarney.

This tunnel is a passage of great arch which is cut through a solid rock whose length is 60 feet, breadth 16 feet and height 20 feet, this was made by government in 1824 for the accomplishment of the new line of road from Killarney to Kenmare.

Dead Cow's Cláff -- Inhabitants 40

Situated in the boundary at the meeting of the three townland points viz. Cloghune, Gurtracussaen and Gurtararee.

This is a very high precipice where thieves or robbers formerly used to drive the cows down this cliff, in order that they might be
