Crummylong Waterfalls (74) -- Inhabitants 41

Crom a glean, stooped or crooked glen.

Cromaghlán -- J.O.D.

Situated in the boundary between the townlands of Crinnagh and Gurtroca.

This waterfall is divided by rocks in to three sections, by which it is changed sideways from its natural course, its height is about 30 feet, south of this on the same stream is another waterfall whose distance from this is about 1000 links, the height of which is about 60 feet making an angle of about 70 degrees and on the North side near Brand Island is another waterfall whose height is about 75 feet making an angle of about 70 degrees and North of this again on the same stream is another waterfall, which falls sideways off a Rock for the distance of 200 links and perpendicular height 80 feet.

Brandy Island (74) -- B. S. 42

Brandy Island J.O.D. -- Inhabitants

x Situated at the meeting of the three townland points viz, Crinnagh, Gurtroca, and Gurtararae.

This island is covered with large Oak trees, mountain ash and holly which grew here spontaneously.

Lane Stream -- B. S. 42

Léin, see lake.

Leane stream -- J.O.D.

Situated in the boundary between the townlands of Turk, and Gurtracussan.

This stream rises in Turk Mountain at the meeting of the three townland points viz, Turk, Crinnagh and Gurtracussan, it flows from the boundary between Turk and Gurtracussan until it falls into Turk Lake at which place it is traditionally told and generally believed by the inhabitants, that there is a hidden treasure there, and guarded by a dog which was formerly famous and was called Bran.

Galway's River (74) -- Inhabitants 43

Abá Sean gaillig, John Galway's river.
