Is the property of Lord Kenmare Killarney, population 130 County cess 49 9s 6d per annum, contains A.2; R1; P.18; of water being half the portion of river which forms the Northern boundary. and A.213; R.2; P.38; of land leaving a content of A.215; R.3; P.38; nearly the whole of which is arable land there is a large quarry on the Eastern part, Tralagh river which runs through a portion of flooded ground forms the Southern boundary.
