Bounded on the North by Clounmeelsan and Drumreeagh, on the West by Kilnanare, on the South by Longfield, and on the East by Firees and Gurtmaghlogh.

Is the property of Lord Kenmare Killarney and population 29, county cess £16 per annum, contains A.260: R.3: P.16: two thirds nearly of which is arable the rest is composed of flooded ground, and bog, Tralagh river forms the Northern boundary dividing it from Clounmeelsan and Drumreeagh. There is a large quarry towards the middle of this townland and a little North of an orchard.

Bounded on the North by Gurthaglogh and Ballanavarrig Molahiv ph and on the West by Longfield on the South by Gurtromarlogh and on the East by Gurtalefsa and Corbally both in Molahiv ph.

Is the property of Lord Kenmare Killarney, population 100, county cess is 4s per acre, contains A.259: R.3: P.9: the whole of which is arable land, the road from Killarney to Tralee passes straight from North to South branching from which towards the West is another road leading to Milltown, the junction of these roads is called Firees cross. There is a National school towards the West, and Firees Castle (in ruins) is close to the Eastern boundary.

Bounded on the North by Tralagh, on the West by Kilnanare, on the South by Knocknamuckala, and on the East by Firees and Gurtromarlogh.

Is the property of Lord Kenmare Killarney, population 50, county cess is 3s per acre, contains A.193: R.3: P.31: being all arable land, through the middle of which lies the road from Milltown to Killarney or Tralee. It is separated from Firees by Owengurtafauda stream, on the West side which is an orchard. There is a quarry on the Western boundary.
