Is the property of Lord Kenmare Killarney, population 30, county cess £14 and contains 387 acres, the whole of which is arable except in the North which is liable to flood. Through the middle of this townland there is a road from Tralee to Milltown, there is a well in the Eastern part called Tubberbullaun. The parish church in ruins stands in this townland.

Bounded on the North by Coolclive (ph of Molahiv) and Ballygamboan Lower, on the West by Rathbeg, on the South by Ballybrack, and on the East by Drumreeagh.

Is the property of Lord Kenmare Killarney, population 68, County cess £9 18s, contains 235; 0: 7; the half of which is arable land the remainder towards the North is flooded, it is divided from the parish of Molahiv and Kiltalla by the high water mark of river Main, there is an orchard in the Western part from which there is a road leading South to the Milltown road.
