Bounded on the North by Rathmore on the West by Rathbeg, and Mount Henry, on the South by Ardawanig, Lecarhoo and Keelties and on the East by Kilnanare.

Is the property of Lord Kenmare Killarney, population 60, county cess £14, contains A.390; R.O; P.22: being all arable land. There is a good road through the middle of the townland leading from Milltown to Killarney or Tralee. Ballybrack fort is in the Southern part, and towards the West there is a pool of water called Cressane.

Bounded on the North by Firess and Gurtalassa (pg of Molahiv) on the West by Longfield, and Knocknamuckala, on the South by Shrane and Boulasillogh and on the East by Russmore.

Is the property of Lord Kenmare Killarney, population 320, County Cess £7 16s 10d and contains A.409; R.1; P.28: the entire of which is arable land. The road from Killarney to Milltown passes North and South through the Eastern part close to the West side of which lies Batterfield fort. Lissgurtromarlogh is in the Southern part, and Butterfield house is in the Eastern part with orchard, eye attached.
