This parish contains no pretestants but contains 1817 Roman Catholics according to the information furnished by the Rev Jm Leng P.P., who resides in the parish of Murhur and L. Le Moyvane. There is a meeting or pattern held yearly in Kneekanure village on the 15th August, they call that day in Irish Lapurt thun-cul-lee, though being lady day the crops generally sown is potatoes, Oats and a little flax, the oats generally is brought to Tarbert for sale, and there expected, the soil in general not good, but good pasture for cows, lime is much used as manure, it is brought from Ballynagayragh in the parish of Lecksna. Wages of farm servants, Males 5s, females 4s with board, labourers 8d per diem in summer, and 6d in winter if employed.
