This Institution was founded in 1884, for the training and employment of Nurses for the sick in hospitals, in private families, and among the poor, and now employs Ninety Nurses and Probationers. The Probationers are trained in the City of Dublin Hospital, the Cork Street Fever Hospital, Barrington's Hospital, Limerick, and the Ballymena and Ayr Hospitals. The Institution trains Nurses for the Queen's Institute for District Nurses for the Poor, and is connected with the Pau Nursing Institution, France. Paying Probationers are received for training on payment of a fee, and Articled Probationers are engaged at a salary. Trained Nurses are supplied on application to the Lady Manager. A limited number of Private Patients are received in the Private Hospital, Mespil. Money orders to be crossed "Royal Bank."

These Hospitals, which are wholly supported by a Parliamentary Grant, contain 312 beds, 110 for surgical, 82 for medical, and 120 for fever and epidemic diseases. During the year ended 31st March, 1891, 1,706 intern patients were admitted, viz.:—into the Richmond, 635; into the Whitworth, 568; into the Hardwicke, 503; 19,026 extern patients were prescribed for during same period, viz., surgical cases, 10,103; medical, 8,923; and 246 trusses were issued gratuitously to the ruptured poor. A Nurses' Training Institute and Home has been established at the Hospitals, from whence trained Medical and Surgical Nurses are sent to tend private patients in all parts of the kingdom.

This Institution is designed for Protestants only and such will be received from all parts of Ireland, three days previous notice for country cases required. Special wards for children. Beds available for patients 135. Pay beds, male and female, for medical, fever, and surgical cases. Dispensaries, open to the poor of all religious denominations daily, except Tuesdays, for treatment of eye, ear, throat, cutaneous and dental diseases, and also diseases peculiar to women, and where medicine is compounded gratuitously for their use. The Hospital is supported entirely by voluntary subscriptions, donations, and legacies. Trained nurses can always be obtained to attend upon patients at their residences in Dublin or country by applying to the Superintendent of Nursing.
