VERE HUNT, of Ballygholan, and subsequently of Glangoole, co. Tipperary, and of Curragh Chase, co. Limerick. He took part in the siege of Youghal. In 1657 and 1660 he was appointed one of the Commissioners of co. Limerick for raising the supplies then demanded for the public service. He *d.* at Curragh, at an advanced age, leaving by Mary his wife (who administered to her husband 24 June, 1681), two sons, Henry, of whom later, and John. The younger son,
